





We Need to Talk about Opioid Addiction

Seventy percent of workplaces have been affected by the opioid crisis, according to estimates from the National Safety Council. In other words, most people reading this column have experienced or are experiencing opioid addiction in their companies, whether they know it or not. No company—and to bring this issue even closer to home, no family—is immune to the ongoing and worsening opioid crisis in the United States. We need to be talking about it.

This urgent call to action was highlighted during the 2024 Building Envelope Contractors Conference, held March 3-5 in Nashville and hosted by the National Glass Association. During the session "Straight Talk: Addiction Treatment & Recovery," Cal Beyer, strategic partner with SAFE Project, and David Argus, operations director of the Contract Division for Karas & Karas Glass, presented some arresting and daunting statistics about the extent of the problem in construction. Consider the following:

162 OVERDOSE DEATHS PER 100,000 WORKERS

The construction and extraction industry faces the worst rate of overdose deaths, with 162 deaths per 100,000 workers per year, according to 2020 data (the most recent available) from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. By comparison, the industry with the second-highest overdose death rate per 100,000 workers is food service, with 118, and the average for all industries is 42.

"It's time for us to stop being afraid of this topic. To recognize that people are hurting. Addiction is usually the result of unresolved stress, anxiety and other stress in our lives," says Beyer.

19% OF CONSTRUCTION WORKERS HAVE SUD

Nearly one in five construction workers, or 19%, has substance use disorder. This compares to 8.5% of adults in the total population, according to data from the National Survey on Drug Use conducted by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration.

"This impacts quality, productivity, risk and safety," says Beyer. "Most organizations have

been impacted. I've worked with hundreds of construction companies nationwide, and they have all been impacted."

34.1% OF CONSTRUCTION WORKERS HAVE AN MSD

Many opioid addictions begin with prescriptions for painkillers following injuries or surgeries, particularly MSD, or musculoskeletal disorders. MSDs are pervasive in construction—in fact, more than one in three workers suffer from some form of MSD.

"This is a gateway to opioids," says Beyer. "The best addiction treatment, suicide prevention and overdose prevention strategy is to continue to focus on injury prevention."

The first step in addressing opioid addiction in your workplace is acknowledging it and talking about it. "We need to stop being afraid of this topic," says Beyer. "This impacts your workforce, your people, your families and your business performance."

There is much more to this story, and to the steps companies can take to create a safe space for workers to talk about their struggles and find success in recovery. The NGA and Glass Magazine will continue to focus on this topic. For now, talk to your people, talk to your family and let's all start chipping away at the stigma of addiction.

Industry technical leaders at the NGA Glass Conference: Isle of Palms | Charleston in Isle of Palms, South Carolina, focused on new codes and standards updates related to glass and glazing, U.S. Department of Energy and Environmental Protection Agency collaborations, the unique and unanticipated demands placed on spandrel glass and glazing from increasingly stringent energy efficient initiatives, laminating best practices and new fabrication instrumentation, retrofitting building stock with highperformance windows, and more. The four-day conference was held Feb. 5-8 and hosted by the National Glass Association, and include meetings of the NGA Advocacy, Fabricating and Forming Committees.

Volunteer appreciation

The conference included a Volunteer Celebration Dinner where the NGA recognized industry volunteers who offer their time and expertise to the betterment of the industry through participation in NGA committees and task groups.

The NGA presented its 2024 Volunteer



of the Year Award to Aaron Thompson, principal research engineer, Viracon, who serves as chair of the NGA Fabricating Committee and has been involved in NGA activities for more than 15 years. "This organization wouldn't be what it is without all of your help," said Thompson while accepting his award. "You are what makes the industry great. Please keep coming. Please keep volunteering and doing your best work here. Being passionate."

NGA members David Evans, Guardian Glass; Tim McGee, Glass Coatings and Concepts; and Bill Sullivan, Brin Glass, were also recognized for their longtime participation and volunteerism.

Committee updates

The Advocacy Committee provided updates on NGA's upcoming Advocacy Days in Washington, D.C.; school safety and federal bird-friendly legislation; recycling architectural glass; and more.

The Fabricating Committee included

updates on the wide range of activities from its various segments: Decorative, Energy, Fire-rated Glazing, Insulating, Laminating, Mirror, Protective Glazing, Recycling/Sustainability and Tempering. For example, attendees heard presentations on thermal bridging, bird-friendly glazing and glass for Europe, and updates on daylighting benefits and school security.





The first priority was to improve and revitalize the acoustics inside the main theater, to make sure it was the best-in-class acoustic experience for the New York Philharmonic. What resulted is a completely new theater inside the building, not just a renovation, creating an intimate and inclusive experience for the audience.

Everything in the building, from door handles to floorboards to railings, feels reassuringly solid. Pulp Studio fabricated over 8,700 square feet of flat and curved, laminated glass railings, using an acid etch glass to meet the design aesthetic and provide an enhanced level of privacy. The bent glass was chemically strengthened for increased surface protection and Pulp Studio's proprietary Precision Edge® technology was used on all the flat glass for a refined and professional look.

1. Auto-replacing purchase orders for stock replenishment. In this potential use case, Al takes over the critical task of stock management. By automating purchase orders, the system ensures that stock levels are maintained efficiently, without the need for manual intervention.

This AI functionality is designed to analyze stock levels, predict future requirements based on usage patterns, and automatically place orders to replenish stock. This streamlines inventory management and reduces the risk of human error, ensuring that the supply

chain is uninterrupted and responsive to demand fluctuations.

2. Intelligent monitoring of production throughput. Another key area where Al is set to make a significant impact is in monitoring and optimizing the throughput of each machine and workstation in the glass manufacturing process.

The AI system learns from operational behavior and adapts to the complexities of the manufacturing process. It can predict bottlenecks, suggest optimal workflows, and ensure that each component of the manufacturing line is

operating at peak efficiency.

This application of AI promises to enhance productivity and reduce downtime by intelligently managing the capacity and throughput of manufacturing resources.

DESIGNING WITH CAST AND HEAT-FORMED DECORATIVE GLASS

Heat-formed decorative glass

Heat-formed glass, sometimes referred to as heat-sculpted glass, is a category of decorative glass in which the pattern or design is incorporated through softening or melting of the glass using high heat. Once the final form is achieved, the glass is cooled. Heat-formed glass is available in various designs and different colors, thicknesses and textures ranging from standard to custom. These products can be used in many interior and exterior applications and are often used in public art installations.

Textured decorative glass diffracts and reflects light. The depth and shape of the textures created change the way light enters the building, allowing daylight into a space while managing glare and direct sunlight.

Safety glazing

Safety glazing may be required in certain circumstances, such as shower enclosures, interior partitions and doors. In these cases, the decorative glass can be

laminated or include a surface-applied safety film tested and certified to safety glazing standards.

Slumped glass

Slumped or "kiln-formed" glass is produced by placing float glass into a kiln over a mold having the desired shape or pattern and heating to the temperature where the glass softens and "slumps" to the form of the mold. The formed glass is then annealed and can be further processed or fabricated. Each glass panel is produced individually, allowing each piece to be unique or for an artistic pattern to be carried through the entire installation. When specifying slumped glass, be aware that variation can occur in the pattern and thickness of the glass, and deep texture may limit the ability to heat treat the glass.

Cast glass

Cast glass is made by either pouring or blowing molten glass into a mold. As the glass goes through a long, slow cooling process, it hardens and takes the shape and texture of the mold. Typical applications for cast glass are glass block, glass tile, lighting and fixtures, sink bowls, architectural accents and public art installations. Cast glass allows for artistic expression in very small batches.

Fused glass

Fused glass is created by melting in a kiln and fusing together two or more

types and colors of glass. Not all glass types can be successfully fused. Each type and color of glass has a "coefficient of expansion," which is the amount and rate at which the glass expands as it is heated and contracts as it cools. To fuse glass, each piece should have a similar coefficient of expansion to avoid cracking during the heating or cooling process. When specifying fused glass in an installation, ensure that the glass can be manufactured in the sizes you require. Fused glass is typically made in smaller sizes than more traditional architectural glass. Sometimes, the opening may need to be divided into sections to accommodate smaller glass lites. Some designs with large variations in thickness may not be able to be heat treated.

Bent/curved glass

Bent or curved glass is flat glass that has been formed into a curved shape or profile using high heat and a mold or frame. It is used for both functional and decorative purposes and can be heat treated, further fabricated into laminated or insulating glazing units, and may incorporate a variety of other decorative features. Bent glass can be used in applications such as railings and balustrades, windows, furniture, revolving entrances, shower and bath enclosures, display cases, and architectural facades.

There are a few issues to consider

when specifying bent or curved glass. Bent glass can be made into many simple or complex shapes; however, all manufacturers will have a minimum and maximum radius that they can produce. Also, due to the heating process, there may be some optical distortion in bent glass, but modern technology has reduced this significantly.

Rolled cast glass

Also known as patterned, textured or obscure glass, rolled cast glass has been imprinted with a texture or pattern at high temperatures while still in a molten or malleable state. Unlike slumped or kiln-cast glass, patterned glass is made directly from a mix of raw materials rather than already manufactured glass. It is offered in large sheet sizes in various patterns, and can be cut and fabricated. Most patterns are directional, meaning the pattern runs in one direction. When considering sheet size, the direction of the pattern should also be considered. Some patterned glass can be heat-treated or laminated.

Channel glass

Channel glass is a structural glass system that creates light-transmitting walls for interior or exterior applications such as curtain walls, storefronts and rain screens. A series of U-shaped cast glass channels is installed into a perimeter frame that allows glass openings to be formed into arcs, serpentine walls, and columns or tower designs. To specify a channel glass system, select the appropriate framing system, select the desired glass texture combination and determine the glass performance requirements such as wind load, thermal and safety requirements.



lass suppliers to the United
States military have long known
the challenges surrounding
contracting for public entity
supply. Each year, a new National
Defense Authorization Act, or NDAA,
approves policies and goals for supplying
items to the military, and 2024 is no
different. While the rules are specific to
one kind of supply agreement, with a
careful eye, the processes and goals can
provide strategies for daily use at every
level of the glazing industry.

Flexibility and scalability

The NDAA divides itself into sections that address different goals or processes. Section 809 directs a pilot program to implement an "anything-as-

a-service" computing model, which is directed at having computer hardware and software available on-demand to respond to the needs of a specific project, without large-term capital expenditures.

Glazing companies need flexibility and scalability as well. The specifications of a product, project or market segment can require capabilities that do not warrant a large capital cost to meet those needs. Outsourcing and temporary skilled-labor agreements can allow glaziers to compete in broader markets. Being prepared to address labor and material scaling on demand can provide opportunities and capabilities so that stretch projects are within reach.

Supplier representations

Various sections of the NDAA prevent the Department of Defense from contracting with firms that provide services to certain adversarial countries and groups. Vendors and contracting parties must prepare country of origin disclosure and representations to meet this section. Violations or misrepresentations of those disclosures can result in contractual and criminal penalties.

Supplier representations are essential to glazing companies at multiple levels. Lifecycle and EPD representations prove crucial to LEED and contractual environmental goals. Material quality and compliance with ASTM methods for sealants, coatings, or strength can impact real-world product performance. Contracting strategies that ensure material compliance with representation, and address responsibility for failures, can provide crucial protections.

Specific temporary market conditions


Section 824 of the NDAA provides temporary measures to address the impact of inflation. This time-limited provision establishes a process to seek modification or reimbursement of costs due solely to economic inflation. Notably, however, there are no appropriations in the NDAA. So, while the process is spelled out, no monies are currently specified for that process.

From a project-contracting perspective, there are two takeaways from this section. Forward thinking at the time of contracting can anticipate particular market challenges, and setting out expected or process accommodations for those challenges can avoid later disputes. However, the absence of a remedy—here, money for the adjustment—makes the process less than ideal. Project modifications need a defined process and a meaningful remedy to have true value and protection.


Fixed-cost adjustment factors

Section 826 allows for the modification of a fixed-price contract. Where a contract price is set, the NDAA will allow certain Economic Price Adjustment terms—upward or downward—based on changes in price, labor or materials. These terms are intended to help address the inherent flexibility in those three market contingencies.

The ability to revisit a contract's value during performance can protect both the owner and the trade. Volatility in market conditions often can make the ultimate performance of an agreement disastrous for one side or the other. Contracting for general adjustments—as opposed to specific triggers like inflation—can provide protection where unanticipated costs effectively negate performance value.

Buy American Act

The term "Made in America" holds value and is essential in government contracting. Section 835 requires that manufactured articles in a major defense acquisition program meet domestic content requirements. With scaling, datetiered obligations, the NDAA mandates that materials be made domestically—ultimately requiring that by Jan. 1, 2029, no less than 75% of the cost of a manufactured component must be within the U.S.

Knowing where materials are made can be challenging in the current economy. The effort to identify cost-component-based calculations is also challenging. It takes work to confirm these factors, document them, and prove compliance when challenged. This is true for "Made in America" or any market-facing representation about product compliance, performance or conditions. Early steps to develop

the evidence necessary to back up these representations can lead to confident contracting and allow more opportunities.

Loser pays

One item in the original 2024 NDAA draft that didn't make it to the final enactment was a requirement that the loser of government bid contests pay the legal fees of both sides. In regular government contracting contests, each side is responsible for their own legal fees, which remains so in the current NDAA. The stated reasons for the condition's removal were that the number of these challenges is relatively small and, ultimately, the term was not needed.

In trade contracting, however, prevailing party clauses and legal fee shifting are essential terms. Questions surrounding who pays in the event of a contest or claim can lead to bet-the-company decisions regarding litigation.

Addressing the scope of fee-shifting provisions at the time of contracting is a crucial risk management and mitigation task.


Governmental contracting can be challenging, and the NDAA's requirements are varied and complex. Even so, the concepts and ideas reflected in these processes have applications well beyond public entity supply and can realize value for suppliers and trades in all markets.



A lifelong inventor inspired by the marvels of flight, Keller's ingenuity led to the development of the iconic Kalwall insulated, light-transmitting technology, revolutionizing the architectural landscape worldwide. From the iconic U.S. Pavilion at the 1958 Brussels World's Fair to contemporary landmarks like the Apple Campus headquarters, Kalwall's footprint spans across diverse architectural marvels, testament to its enduring legacy of innovation and excellence. As Kalwall nears its 70th year celebration, its mission remains unwavering: to illuminate spaces with the transformative power of daylight, enriching lives and shaping a brighter future for generations to come.

I recently sat down with Samuel Keller, vice president of product development, and one of the five grand-children of founder Robert R. Keller Sr. working at Kalwall, to discuss the company's approach to distinguishing themselves in the industry through innovative technology, extensive customization options, and a commitment to quality and sustainability.

How has Kalwall evolved over the years, and what sets it apart?

We pride ourselves on being the market leader in high-performance translucent daylighting. We can claim many industry firsts over the years, but our core competence is still essentially the same. Kalwall offers a versatile, mass-customizable, daylighting system that can be tailored to meet a wide variety of project needs. Everything we do is built to specifications because no two buildings are the same. In the end, I think what sets us apart is our reputation as an innovator, Kalwall's brand awareness among AEC professionals, and our track record of delivering product on time and on budget.

We have a broad reach, a network of trusted distributors and installers, and other strategic advantages that we have honed over time. That matters a lot but, even more so, we offer a useful and timely building technology that solves real problems and performs well over the long term. All buildings benefit from well-designed, naturally daylit spaces, but the ultimate Kalwall differentiator is the light quality our systems produce. We transmit full visible spectrum daylight and diffuse it completely for well-lit, glare-free, interior spaces.

The movement toward daylighting, energy efficiency and thermal performance are still leading architectural design. How are you addressing these trends?

Our 175CW translucent insulated glazing unit, or TIGU, is a new solu-

tion that makes it easier to design with Kalwall for façade applications. We live in a glass and aluminum-dominated world, and in many cases, designers have already specified their curtain wall or storefront system and they're evaluating glazing options separately. Kalwall 175CW is our effort to provide a high-performance, translucent glazing that integrates seamlessly into more of those framing systems. These 1-3/4-inch-deep TIGUs were developed to match triple-pane IGU thicknesses, compatible with most thermally improved curtain wall systems available.

What specific features or technologies differentiate it from existing products?

Our mission is to bring balanced, natural daylight into more buildings, and this new solution makes doing so much easier. While this kind of curtain wall integration option is new for us and for the designers and specifiers we work with, we can now offer the added convenience and suitability for more projects. There are so many projects where designers and specifiers are looking to mix and match glazing materials into the same framing system. With 175CW, coordination and integration are greatly simplified, making it virtually 'plug and play' for designers and installers. We want to make all our products easy to work with, and the offered advantages so compelling, that they are hard to ignore.

Can you describe the design and development process involved, any challenges?

It was interesting. The product development challenge here was to take an inch of thickness out of our standard 2-3/4-inch Kalwall panel without losing a third of the properties we're known for. We worked hard to optimize both the glazing performance—visible light transmissittance, U-factor and solar heat gain coefficient—and the strength-

to-weight of the product to perform well in a variety of four-sided capture, curtain wall systems. In the end, we achieved values that are very close to the thermal performance and solar control associated with our thicker 2-3/4-inch and 4-inch panels making the 175CW a glazing option for any low- to mid-rise building in North America.

Are there specific industry challenges that you believe deserve more attention?

Our main challenges are getting more people to consider translucency instead of, or alongside, transparent materials like vision glazing, and for more design professionals to understand the science of daylighting to deliver and manage natural light within buildings. Transparency is great for providing views and visual connection, but translucency is better for producing quality daylight.

What developments can we expect from Kalwall in terms of daylighting solutions?

We have several areas of ongoing R&D, and are developing more versions of TIGU products. We're also looking at building-integrated photovoltaics for power generation, daylight harvesting optimization with dynamic glazing technologies, and reducing embodied carbon and planning for end of life, among others.

The building envelope acts as a kind of second skin, and we increasingly spend our days inside, so there will continue to be more innovation that will further optimize building performance, minimize environmental impacts, and prioritize human-centered design solutions that support people living, working, learning and playing in the built environment every day. ■

eading glass fabricators report a year of solid investment and innovation, as well as strong sales. Companies also report slower growth, likely due to constructionwide issues with inflation, project delays and resulting cost increases.

Merger and acquisition activity early in 2024 suggests that the construction landscape will continue to change and consolidate. In February, Oldcastle BuildingEnvelope acquired Midwest Glass Fabricators, headquartered in Highland, Michigan. In March, Trulite Glass & Aluminum Solutions finalized the acquisition and merger of American Insulated Glass. Additionally, Gardner Glass Products was acquired by a private equity firm, Ironbridge, which also owns Walker Glass Co.

Challenges with raw glass sourcing did appear to ease in 2023, but hurdles remain, even for the country's top fabricators. "The cost of domestic float glass has increased significantly, and that poses pricing and competitive bid challenges," says Adam Shearer, president and partner, Imagic Glass. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, material pricing (measured through the Producer Price Index) for glass and glass products increased 4.6% during 2023, and was up 23% compared to pre-pandemic.

Though attendant challenges like supply chain seem to have eased, paused projects threaten a negative cascading effect on the industry. "Many projects have been delayed, which has an impact on supply chain management," says Carey Mobius, president and CEO, Garibaldi Glass Industries. "Staffing resources have been difficult to maintain, and as a result, there has been instability in overall manufacturing."

WHERE RESPONDENTS PURCHASED RAW GLASS IN 2023.




WHAT PERCENTAGE OF YOUR BUSINESS IS RETROFIT?



he glass industry continues to expand its innovative products. Fabricator respondents reported increased production of several high-performance glass types, especially birdfriendly glazing. A majority, 72%, of respondents say they fabricated bird-friendly glass in 2023, a year-over-year increase of six percentage points; 68% of respondents also said they felt bird-friendly glass was a popular design trend. This is unsurprising given the amount of new codes and legislation across the country that are pushing for bird-friendly building solutions.

Security and impact-rated glass, as well as energy-efficient products, were close seconds in popularity this last year; 67% of respondents said security glass was a trend, and 60% named energy-efficient glass.


Regarding glass sizes, 86% of respondents expect sizes to continue to grow in 2024, up seven points from last year. Despite this, the number of companies that report making jumbo glass is down a few

percentage points for 2023, though this may be due to the lack of an industry standard definition of what constitutes jumbo glass.

Companies report doing more retrofit work in 2023, possibly due to economic uncertainty and project pauses, or other market factors. This includes higher interest rates prompting more people to renovate rather than buy new, or sustainable building trends urging more renovation. Seven percent of last year's respondents said retrofit work comprised 50% or more of their work; this year, almost a third said that retrofit represented half or more of their business projects.

Companies continue to procure raw glass primarily from North America, with Europe and Asia as distant seconds. As noted later in the report, respondents say that procuring raw glass eased significantly in 2023; this year, only 5% of respondents named it a major challenge, compared to 30% in 2022.



ompanies largely did what they planned to do in terms of investment in 2023, investing in fabrication equipment and launching new product lines. Eighty-five percent of respondents said they invested in equipment in 2023, surpassing the 81% of respondents who said they planned to do so in last year's report. Forty-five percent of companies said they launched new product lines in 2023,

compared to the 46% of companies that reportedly planned to in the 2023 report.

Overall, 78% of responding companies said they added some type of production capacity in 2023, down almost 10 points from the previous year; possibly due to the continued difficulty with inflation reported by respondents. While 18% of respondents said they would add locations and/or manufacturing space in last year's report, only 8% of this year's respondents report doing so.




Further automation, and plans to automate, are down year-over-year. While 65% of respondents last year said they automated manufacturing processes, only 53% of this year's respondents report having automated processes in 2023. While 66% of last year's respondents planned to automate, 56% of this year's respondents say they plan to do so in the coming year.

Equipment purchases and new product launches again top investment plans for 2024, according to respondents.


OF FABRICATORS ADDED PRODUCTION CAPACITY IN 2023.






SALES AND CHALLENGES

SALES REMAIN HIGH, BUT GROWTH SLOWED IN 2023.







verall gross sales increased for most companies in 2023. Seventy percent of reporting companies said they had higher year-over-year sales, compared to 77% in last year's report. More companies, 11%, did report lower year-over-year sales, compared to 2% last year.


Inflation remained a major pain point in 2023, and a likely obstacle to increased sales; 46% named it their major issue, compared to 37% the previous year. Respondents indicated that inflation and interest rates have had, and could continue to have, a negative impact on the whole industry and impact further growth.

"The economic fallout of higher interest rates have affected planned construction in the building markets," says Alex Miramontez, vice president and chief financial officer, Glaz-Tech Industries Inc. "Inflation in raw materials have hurt, and as we pivot

into new markets, it's hard to increase pricing for our legacy project business, so we have to eat that cost," says Kevin Roth, founder and CEO, Privacy Glass Solutions.


Logistics and transportation remained as much a sore point last year as in the previous report, according to respondents. "Logistics challenges can be attributed to factors such as transportation costs, customs regulations and potential delays at borders," says Amanda Gonzalez, PR and communications manager, Tecnoglass.

By geographic region, construction growth evolved similarly to what was predicted by respondents in last year's report, with the Northeast and Southeast again taking the lead. Respondents predict the same pattern moving into 2024.





YOUR 2024 SOCIAL MEDIA FARMERS' ALMANAC

The ever-evolving machine that is "social media" continues to steamroll into 2024. An estimated 4.9 billion people used social media across the globe in 2023, and that number is expected to jump to approximately 5.85 billion users by 2027. Let's look at some trends we can expect this year.

Platform expectations

The average social media user logs on to seven different platforms monthly, but where should we focus our professional efforts? Here are the 2023 business usage statistics with these platform giants.

- **TikTok** saw the largest growth of business content in 2023. It is currently the fastest-growing platform in the United States, especially with younger audiences.
- LinkedIn will continue to be a professional-focused platform, but it is trending toward more personal

and less-curated content.

- **Instagram** is heavily saturated with strong brand presence, but it still saw slight growth in business usage in 2023.
- YouTube saw little business use growth in 2023, but it retains the number two spot worldwide for most social media users at 2.491 billion.
- **Snapchat** also saw little business growth in 2023, but it remains in the top three for the most-used platforms by Gen Z.
- Facebook remains king of global social media at 3.03 billion monthly users, but it saw a slight decrease in brand platform usage.
- X (formerly Twitter) saw the largest decrease in business usage of the platforms on this list at 7% less brand activity.

Real connection

Social media audiences continue to demand authenticity and real connections from brands and businesses. Content should treat your target group as people rather than simply a consumer.

The Stanley brand recently replaced a vehicle from a customer who posted a TikTok about her car catching fire—incredibly, even after the fire, the Stanley cup in her car remained unharmed and with ice still in it.

Commitment to sustainability

Research also proves that consumers prefer companies that actively work to reduce their environmental impact. Content highlighting sustainability efforts is consumed favorably. Allbirds, and their swarm of celebrity users, regularly highlight environmental conscientiousness with their sustainable processes and materials.

This is also seen in a rising trend called "deinfluencing" that is emerging on Instagram, TikTok and YouTube. As the desire to push back against overconsumption and unnecessary waste increases, popular social media personalities are using their leverage to promote brands and help their audience think more critically and sustainably about their purchases.

Short-form video content

For social media content, 66% of consumers report that short-form videos are the most engaging. We see this in the growth of TikTok and Instagram Reels. Be aware that there is an increase in social media users who watch videos without sound, so video captions are paramount. In addition, video captions improve search engine optimization, or SEO, rankings by allowing the script in your video to be searchable and aiding those who are hard of hearing.
